- Promotes intellectual, emotional, and social development of the child
- Orients other staff to the client needs and Plan of Care
- Liaison for social service agencies families and staff members regarding service
- Contribute to the growth and development of the child while performing additional assigned responsibilities as necessary and appropriate

A C.P.T. is a professional trained advanced child care assistant who has been educated in the philosophy of nursing, including medical, emotional and behavioral challenges as well as social service and protective needs of children with an emphasis on the handicapped and special needs child.
