IN EDUCATION AND MEDICAL SERVICES CERTIFIED PEDIATRIC TECHNICIANS*

- REDUCE ADMINISTRATOR CONCERNS by supplying assistants who understand their students' issues and all the interventions that improve the potential outcome of the child
- IMPROVE EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS for employed teacher aids that work with special needs children mainstreamed or placed in vocational schools, and private schools for the disabled
- WORK UNDER THE DIRECTION of the school nurse and other authorities
- PROVIDE GUIDANCE FOR ALL CHILDREN, especially those who are already under the stress of peer pressures as emerging teenagers
- RECOGNIZE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF DISEASE AND PROBLEMS associated with challenged children as a result of learned nursing fundamentals instruction
- AIM FOR THE CHILD'S BEST OUTCOME recognizing the child's limitations or extenuating circumstances.
- PROVIDE A SAFETY NET AND TRUSTED CONFIDANT
- PROVIDE CONTINUITY OF CARE from home to school.
- ASSURE PARENTS that the best professionals are working with their children

IN PROTECTIVE & SOCIAL SERVICES CERTIFIED PEDIATRIC TECHNICIANS

- IMPROVE DYFS AND OTHER PROTECTIVE SERVICES by using the CPT in the agency organizational plan.
- PROVIDE THE CARE FOR CHILDREN in the DYFS and Foster Care System, The Court System, and families in dysfunctional situations long-term care facilities, hospitals.
- BECOME TEAM MEMBERS assisting disabled and special needs children at home or alternative care
- PROVIDE WORKERS AND SOCIAL WORKERS WITH A LIAISON able to recognize and properly assess dangerous situations.
- SUPPORT THE STAFF with the medical component to recognize disease signs and symptoms
- PROVIDE A SAFETY NET and trusted confidant
- REPORT SIGNS OF CONCERN because they recognize the abused, neglected and distressed child as well as signs and symptoms of illness or disease
